

3rd August 2009--rescue:

Lilian: Good evening!

Lilian: Is that where you lived?

Yes, I'm looking for Hendersons, okay?

Lilian: yes! What do you remember before you started to look for Hendersons? Were you feeling okay? Did you have a pain, or not feel very well?

I feel confused.

Lilian: Well I'll explain that in a moment.

I can't find my directions.

Lilian: Well, this will probably come as a bit of a shock and I don't know how it happened. Maybe you had an accident. Were you in a car, or vehicle of any kind?

No

Lilian: walking?

Walking.

Lilian: Okay. Well, I don't know what has happened, but something has caused you to die.

Rubbish!

Lilian: You're talking to me and I'm talking to you **(Yes)** but that's what's happened.. The way you are talking to me is that you are using a friend of mine. You are using her voice to speak to me

No! No! That's rubbish!

Lilian: Did you ever think what would happen when you died?

Died?

Lilian: Did you ever think about what would happen?

No!

Lilian: Was that the finish or do I live on? Did you think along those lines? No?

I think it's the end.

Lilian: Yes, well I've got a surprise for you. It's not the end.

George: It's only the end of the body. The mind continues. You clearly have your mind, don't you?

Of course I do! I'm looking for Hendersons & Sons.

Lilian: I wouldn't bother about that at the moment. Let's just get this straight about what has happened to you. Because until you realise what's happened and accept what we are going to tell you, you can't move on. What happens when you die.....

I don't have to listen to this.

Lilian: Well, it's up to you, but you'll be silly not to listen, now you have started.

Lilian: I do understand. It must be a bit of a shock, but it is nothing to worry about. That is George sitting next to you. My name is Lilian.

George: There is nothing to worry about at all.

Lilian: What you have to do is : you have to start another life. We call it the Spirit Life. You have finished with the human bit and now you are start5inf fresh in the spirit world.
